The Nairobi National Museum is located at the Museum Hill which is a short distance from Villa Rosa Kempinski. The Museum was initiated in 1910 by a group of enthusiastic naturalists under the then East Africa and Uganda Natural History Society [currently the East African Natural History Society (EANHS)], who needed a place to keep and preserve their collections of various specimens. Built in 1929, it was then named Coryndon Museum in honor of Sir Robert Coryndon, one time Governor of Kenya. In 1963 after independence, it was re-named the National Museum of Kenya (NMK). It is the flagship museum for the National Museums of Kenya, housing celebrated collections of Kenya’s History, Nature, Culture and Contemporary Art.

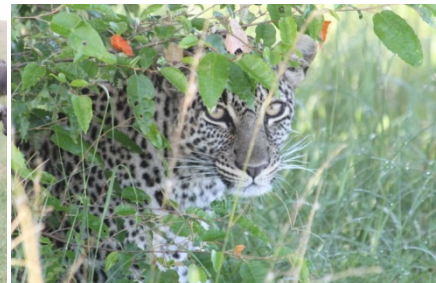
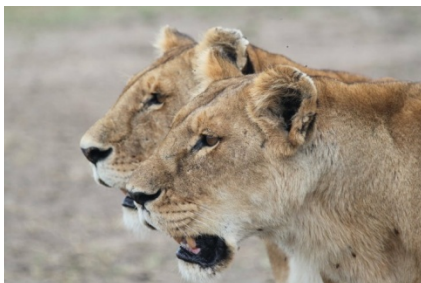
Afternoon Game Drive and an Evening of Fashion - September 9
